Though Hunt Partners has just celebrated three years of existence, Mehra has been in the search business for ten years of which six years were with Horton. A Wharton alum, he has managed to build a successful franchise in financial services and IT, along with partner Arjun Erry. His firm's recent searches include MDs for PE firm Clearwater Capital, BPO Serco, and IT company 3Com, and he has managed to build an impressive capability in the growing PE sector. Mehra also runs a search firm called Third Sector Partners which focuses on the nonprofit and non-governmental sectors, while Mehra Sr. runs a firm focused on Middle East market.

The Egon Zehnder quartet of Sanjiv Sachar, Sonny Igbal, Rajeev Vasudeva and Govind lyer are clearly the top dogs in the search business in India. One of the first international search firms to set up shop in India, Egon has been at the top in CXO search locally even when it's not the top pick globally, and that speaks a lot about the work the local partners have done over the years. "Our quality of consultants and value system has helped us achieve a position of respect," says managing partner Sanjiv Sachar.

Egon's Indian practice continues to be among the fastest growing globally along with China, a fact that Sachar acknowledges in a telephone interview from Athens, where the partners are attending a global conference. Contrary to what's believed, 70% of the firm's revenues come from local Indian companies and its revenues are estimated between Rs 30-35 crore. Some of their recent publicly known marquee searches have been the Centurion Bank of Punjab top leadership team, Vinita Bali for Britannia, and Guneet Chadha for Deutsche Bank (India).

The ex-banker, ex-management consultant turned exec-utive search honcho has led the world's number one search firm (as per Hunt-Scanlon's ranking) in India since 1999. Though he manages Korn/Ferry's India opera-tions, Gupta also focuses on CXO searches in the financial services and professional services sectors. Aided by colleagues such Ketaki Gupte, Madhav Saran, and Geeta Dang, Gupta and his team have managed to grab some of the top CEO searches lately, and stage an impressive comeback after the firm went through a rough patch three years ago.
